BRIEF

Enhance the meaning of a selected word with a typographical solution.

DIRECTIVE

Select 10 words from the provided list and explore their expressive potential by manipulating the letter-forms. A successful design not only enhances the meaning of a word but is executed in a clever, unexpected way and is aesthetically pleasing. Legibility is paramount — your word should be immediately recognizable. Avoid introducing images, illustration, add-on elements or colors. Your challenge is to manipulate the letter-forms by exploiting the characteristics of the letters themselves. This assignment requires a high degree of experimentation, creativity and playfulness. Look for several solutions within a single word and refine your concepts down to the strongest outcome. You are required to complete 10 typographic solutions but I encourage you to select additional words. You will receive extra credit for each of your appended words.

Here are some things to consider...

- · Look for potential within the fonts of a particular typeface i.e. Bold, Italics, Varying Weights, Outline etc.
- · Do certain typeface styles better suit the meaning of your word? i.e. Slab Serif vs. San Serif
- What sort of manipulations can you explore? Stretch, Skew, Flip, Duplicate, Fade, Rotate, Scale, Shear, Distort, Twist, Warp, Roughen, Opacity, Subtract, Pattern, Merge, Divide, Trim etc.
